Bri Moussette homers twice to lead Hampshire softball over Frontier

Bri Moussette broke the game open with a grand slam in the fifth inning as the Hampshire Regional softball team beat Frontier Regional 6-4 Tuesday in South Deerfield.

Moussette clobbered an Abbie Fydenkevez pitch over the left-field fence to give Hampshire a 6-2 lead. Moussette, who had a solo homer in the fourth, finished with five RBIs.

Alison Bednarsky added an RBI single while Ashlee McGan struck out six and walked two for Hampshire (4-1, 4-1 Franklin).

Frontier (6-1, 4-1) scored with two outs in the seventh and had two runners on but a groundout ended the rally.

Angelica Perfido and Cassidy Stankowski (double, two runs) each had three hits while Casey Gavin (double) and Brie Cook each had two hits for the Red Hawks, who stranded five runners in scoring position.

Fydenkevez struck out two and walked three in the loss.

Easthampton 11, Holyoke Catholic 1 - Freshman Caelin Motter won her first varsity game in her second start as the Eagles (1-5) earned their first victory of the season at home.

Motter struck out five, walked two and scattered four hits.

Cara Scheesher (three RBIs, two runs) tripled while Becca Lambert (two RBIs, run) went 3-for-3 and Molly Cabana (run) 2-for-4 for the Eagles.

Abbey Craig, Sarah Roberge (run), Jenn Perry (double) and Megan Graves each had one hit for the Gaels (3-5).
